On 16/02/2017 we had visited to Cheeta Camp A-Sector and surveyed 20 houses. We had observed that most of the families are nuclear and very few families are extended. Most of the grandparents and parents are not educated due to financial and family problems. Most of the grandparents were working in the shipping company as laborer and parents are working as household and hand embroidery work. Most of the grandparent's monthly income was below 5000 and parents income is between 5000-10,000. Most of the dropout's reasons are not interested in studies and financial problems. Most of the students are going to Urdu, English and Hindi Medium.

The remarks about the school are-

1. Not conducting proper PTA meeting.
2. Most of the teachers are not regular.
3. Students don't like to eat the meals provided by school.
4. No punctuality or strictness followed by the school

Most of the family members have all the documents. Most of the reasons for migration are lack of jobs in their native place. People in A- Sector are mostly Muslim and open caste. The people in A-Sector are mostly living in rented house with 1 room and all family members use public toilet/Sulabh.

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On 17th February 2017, we took survey in 2 areas of Cheeta Camp i.e. C-Sector. We had completed 80 houses on 17th Feb 2017. First we visited C- Sector (Nanawadi). The houses in this sector were very congested. The lane was also small in that area. Most of the parents and grandparents were not educated. So the parents are also not interested in their child's education.

We also went to E-Sector; there were many people who have been migrated people. Most of the people are migrated from Tamil Nadu for their job or studies. Most of the students in this sector go to Turbhe Mumbai Public School (English Medium). Students view for the teacher is that the teachers are not regular.
